## AFFILIATED SOCIETY SPOTLIGHT

### A Magical Day for Miami Beach Orchid Society Keikis

On January 11th, members of the Miami Beach Orchid Society, in collaboration with the Miami Beach Garden Club, gathered under the huge banyan tree in Bayshore Park to take a group of 32 youngsters and their parents in hand and provide a magical day of orchid education. The perfect introduction to the event was that the children, dubbed as Keikis, learned the meaning of the actual word “keiki!” And of course, a nice *Phalaenopsis* with a substantial keiki was the ideal illustration for them.

Repotting began with a visit to the Orchid Garden Ladies where the Keikis examined the roots of their individual plants and saw how important roots are for a thriving *Phalaenopsis*. They removed existing medium and dead and desiccated roots and they were amazed that these orchids do not grow in soil because they’re epiphytes – a new word for them to add to their orchid vocabulary! They were given a fresh clay pot – with lots of holes – and a special orchid mix containing bark and a little moss. The ladies, with some assistance from the Moms and Dads, helped them to get their orchid situated and settled in its new home.

When each child had finished repotting the plant, they went to see the Orchid Fairy who gave them printed care instructions and a magic wand (made from spadix of a coconut inflorescence). She recited a sweet little poem or “spell” for them that she had written herself:

#### Planting the Spell

Hello, tiny orchid, today is the day!  
We plant you gently with magic and say...  
No dirt, no rush, just moss and bark,  
With room to breathe and grow and spark.  
I'll give you light and show you care,  
Shower you with love, your beauty I'll share.  
Grow, grow, grow...I will wait and I'll be patient.  
I'm sending you good vibrations, you beautiful creation.

What a wonderful experience for these children to learn the basics about orchids, their beauty and how to make them flourish! And kudos to both the members of the Miami Beach Orchid Society and the Miami Beach Garden Club, as well as the parents, for promoting this educational event and instilling a love of orchids in the hearts of these youngsters! It is apparent that everyone had a lovely and memorable day!
